Digital cultural heritage

- Refers to the use of digital practices and technology in the preservation and dissemination of tangible and intangible cultural heritage.
- Involves already existing conversion by experts of artifacts of culture with an ancient or recent past provenance into digital facsimiles for preservation and dissemination.
- Often but not always a new creation (e.g. digitally born artifacts.)
- Also includes end-user content created by people and communities, who may or many not be experts, (e.g. citizen amateur historians, non-professional scientists) as part of their interaction with diverse heritage-related data applications.




Digital cultural heritage
